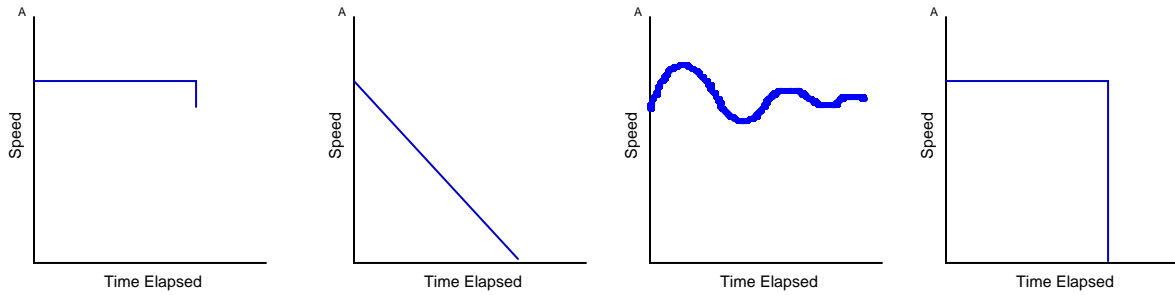


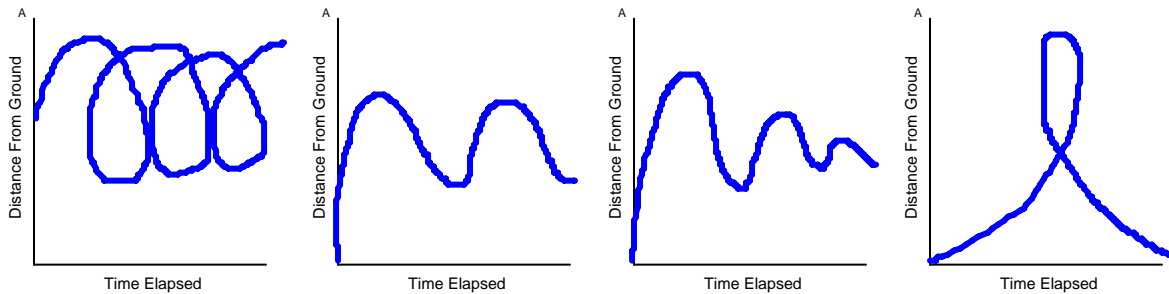
Identifying Qualitative Graphs

Directions: Circle the graph that best describes the given statement. For enrichment purposes, explain using complete sentences, the reasons why the other graphs do not fit the given statement.

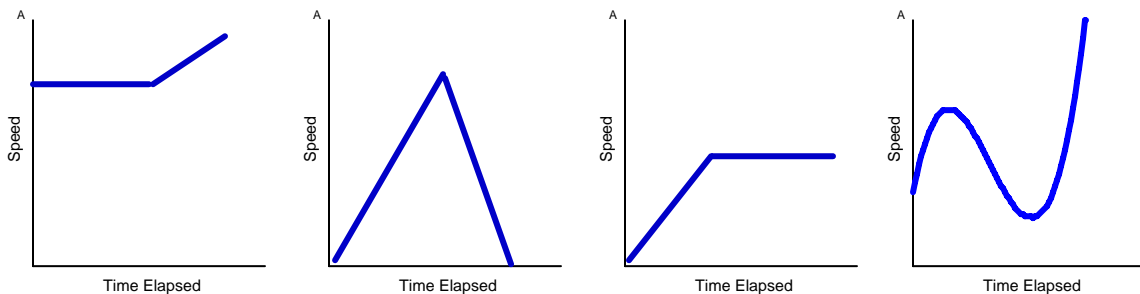
1. A train pulls into a station and lets off its passengers.



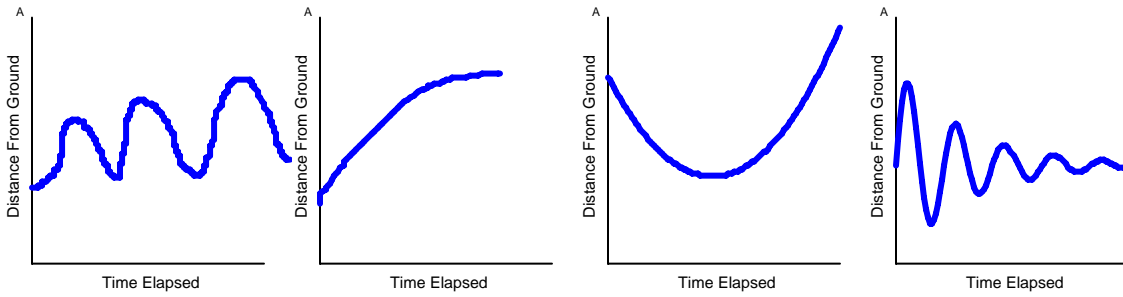
2. A man takes a ride on a ferris wheel.



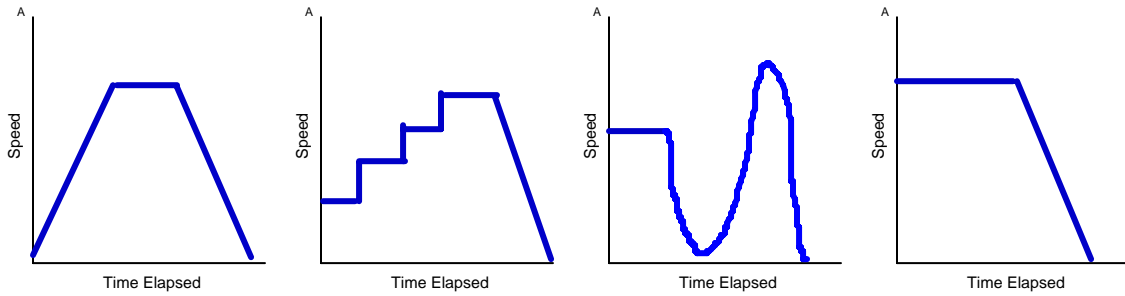
3. A woman climbs a hill at a steady pace and then starts to run down one side.
