Learning to Paraphrase

Activity 1 Exploring Paraphrasing

Activity Overview

In this activity, students will use information available on various websites to create directions for paraphrasing. Students may work in groups or individually depending on web access, but they will collaborate as a class to determine directions and advice for paraphrasing, including when one might decide to paraphrase, how to go about it, and how to cite the information paraphrased.

Tip

Students will need access to various websites (suggested sites are provided) in order to determine the ways paraphrasing is presented to different potential audiences. They will need help synthesizing this information to create easy-to-follow directions for paraphrasing.

Directions

Before the Activity Begins

Send students the **Learning to Paraphrase** edc file using TI-Navigator™, a TI-GRAPH LINK™ cable, or a USB cable and go over the activity objectives and directions. Divide the class into groups of 3-4 students.

During the Activity




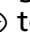

Students will peruse various websites to gain a variety of perspectives on paraphrasing advice. Often, college writing centers provide such advice online. A Google search (www.google.com) on paraphrasing can produce a list of sites worth investigating. Here are two sites to suggest to students:

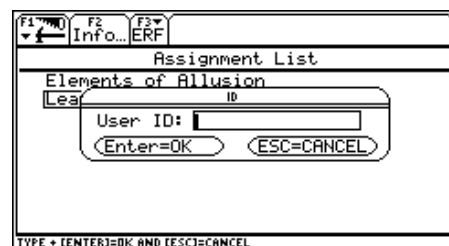
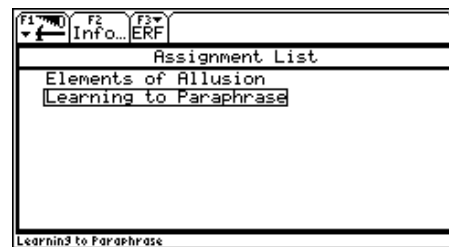
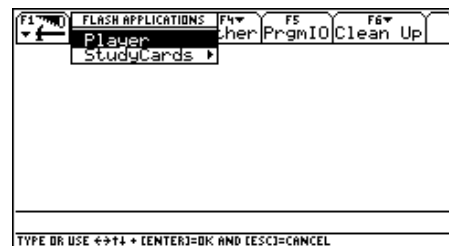

Each of these websites offers advice on paraphrasing, including when and why one would choose to paraphrase instead of quote, but neither site contains identical advice. Your students' task is to synthesize the information provided on these and/or other sites or in other resources and to write directions for paraphrasing within their small workgroups.

Use the following instructions to access and use the **Learning to Paraphrase** files on devices. The action steps are the actions students need to perform to obtain the files and use the exercises on their devices. Additional information for the teacher appears in shaded boxes.

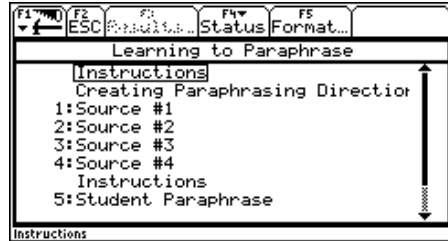
Voyage™ 200 PLT (or TI-92 Plus)

1. Turn on the device and press the  **Apps** key. Highlight the **Player** Application using  .
2. Press **ENTER**. The Assignment List is displayed. Use   to highlight the **Learning to Paraphrase** file if more than one assignment is in the list.
3. Press **ENTER**. Enter your ID to sign in.

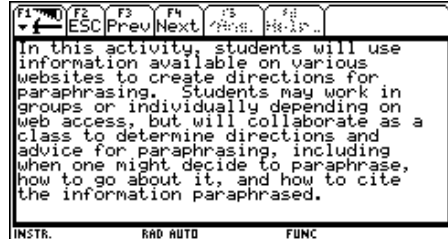


- Press **ENTER**. The files that comprise this assignment are listed. Use **↔** to scroll the list.

Highlight the first **Instructions** file.



- Press **ENTER** to open the file. Use **↑** to scroll the text.



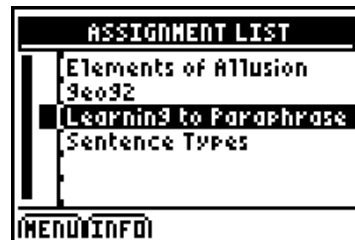
- To close this file (or any other file), press **F2: ESC**. This redisplay the Item List for the assessment. To access the next file in the Item Menu list from an open file, press **F4: Next**.

TI-83 Plus

- Turn on the device and press the **Apps** key to display this screen. Select the **Player** Application by highlighting the number next to it using **↑** **↓**.



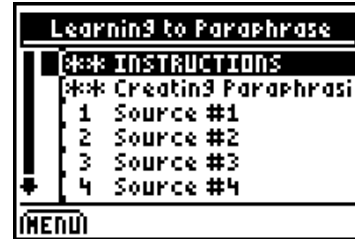
- Press **ENTER**. Press **ENTER** again to move past the title screen. The **Assignment List** is displayed. Use **↑** **↓** to highlight the **Learning to Paraphrase** assignment, and then press **ENTER**.



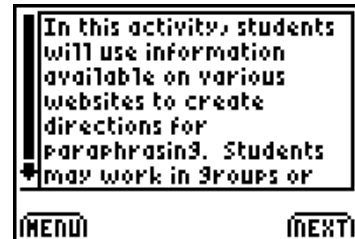
- Enter your ID to sign in.



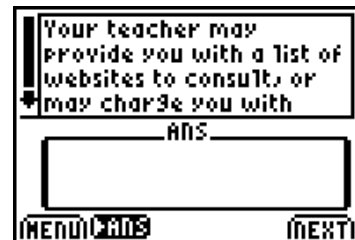
4. Press **[ENTER]**. The first item in the list is the **Instructions** file. Highlight this option.



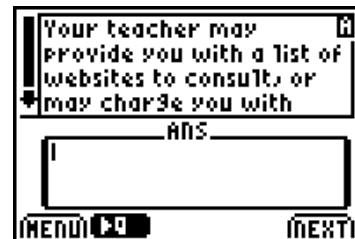
5. Press **[ENTER]** to open the file. Use **[↑]** **[↓]** to scroll the text.



6. To access the Source #1 - #4 files, students can either close the current file and return to the Item List by pressing **MENU**, redisplaying the Item List and selecting the desired file, or they can press **NEXT** from the opened file.



7. To move the cursor into the text box, press **>ANS**.



After the Activity

Lead a class discussion about paraphrasing. Allow each group to share their version of paraphrase directions. Adapt these as a class exercise to create directions that fit the level and requirements of the class. Students should note these directions for future use.
