Activity Overview

Directions

Before the Activity Begins

Provide the groups with 10-15 minutes to read through their skits one final time and make any final preparations. If possible, film the skits for peer evaluation on another day. If filming is not possible, distribute copies of the NoteFolio™ file, **SKITEVAL.8xv**, so that the students can evaluate each skit as it is performed.

During the Activity

Student groups perform the skits. Realistically, this may take more than one class period.
