Activity 2 Collaborating with Parts of Speech

Materials

Activity Overview

Students work in pairs to create lists of words (using all eight parts of speech) that could be used to describe an image, either online or one provided by the teacher. These lists will form the basis of the vocabulary for a short story or poem that clearly and creatively describes the image.

Tip

Provide numerous options of images for students to pick. Create a sample list with the students or offer an example to which they can refer. Provide specific guidelines concerning the poem or story, ensuring that the words used remain varied and descriptive.

Directions

Before the Activity Begins

Determine whether students will use online photographs or pictures, or whether you will provide photographs or magazines from which they can select images. Explain the objectives to the students and direct them to open the **Parts of Speech** edc resource file for this activity. An explanation of the activity is provided in the **Directions** file. Have students pair up with their partners.


During the Activity

Partner groups should work together to create lists of words about their picture. Circulate among the groups to advise them, reminding them to be creative in their choices. Students should think of 10 nouns, 10 verbs, 5 adjectives, 5 adverbs, 5 prepositions (or prepositional phrases), and 3 pronouns to describe their picture. After creating the list, the pairs should work together using the **Story or Poem** file to write a short story or poem, providing a description of the picture or a fictional tale describing what could be happening in the picture. Students can take turns recording information or one student can be the recorder for this activity.






2. Press ENTER. Review the instructions prior to beginning the assignment.






 Press F4: Next to access the Word List file. Enter the parts of speech that you believe best describe your picture.



5. Using the parts of speech recorded in the previous step, enter your short story or poem that best describes your picture.







- 3. Press ENTER. Review the instructions prior to beginning the assignment. If necessary, use ▲ ▼ to scroll the text.
- Press NEXT to access item Word List. If necessary, use to scroll the text. Enter your response by pressing ANS and beginning to type.












6. Press NEXT to access item Story or Poem. If necessary, use to scroll the text. Enter your response by pressing ANS and beginning to type.



After the Activity

Have students exchange their lists and stories or poems using the TI Unit-to-Unit cables. Allow pairs to read one another's lists and stories or poems. Students should also share the image they used as the basis. Ensure that students have used a variety of parts of speech in their drafts.
