Activity 1 Exploring Pantoum Poems

Activity at a Glance

◆ Subject: English

◆ Subject Area: English/Language Arts

◆ Category: Literary Genres

◆ Topic: Poetry

♦ **Grade Level:** 7 - 12

◆ Prerequisites: None

◆ Total Teaching Time: 45-60 minutes (about one class period)

Materials

◆ Sample pantoums

Overhead projector

 Student Work Sheet, Pantoum Analysis Guide

Activity Overview

In this activity, students analyze a pantoum poem in order to understand its structure.

Directions

Before the Activity Begins

Place a pantoum on the overhead projector for the entire class to see. Ask one student to read the poem aloud. Do not discuss the poem; students will discuss a different pantoum later on.

During the Activity

Divide the students into groups of four. Give each group a different pantoum to read and analyze as well as copies of the student work sheet, **Pantoum Analysis Guide**.

Or consider writing your own pantoums ahead of time as examples.

Each group will:

- 1. Read the pantoum.
- 2. Determine its structure.
- 3. Read the pantoum to the class.

Instructions for students are provided in the **Pantoum Analysis Guide**.

After the Activity

Place a pantoum on the overhead projector (different from the one you used at the beginning of the class.) Ask a student to read the poem aloud. Review the structure of a pantoum.

Homework

The small groups will meet again in the next class session. Each student will need to bring the lyrics for a song he/she likes. The group's success depends upon each student remembering to bring these lyrics to the next class session.

Content

- ♦ What is the poem about?
- ♦ What is the mood or tone of the poem? What words help convey the mood?
- ♦ Do you like the poem? Why or why not?

Structure

- ♦ How many unique lines are there in the pantoum?
- ♦ How many times is each line repeated?
- Describe the pattern of repetition.

Sharing

Your group will soon be reading the pantoum to the class. Decide who will read which lines. Every person in the group must participate.
