**Dana Morse** began his career in mathematics education in 1999 after graduating from SUNY Cortland with a B.Sc. in Mathematics Education 7–12 and a minor in Computer Science. He earned his M.Sc. in Recreation and Leisure Management Education from SUNY Cortland in 2004.

Dana taught high school mathematics for 3 years at Moravia Central Schools. During his time, he spearheaded the rollout of the new Math A curriculum, writing content aligned to New York State standards. Dana was awarded the Moravia Teacher of the Year Award in 2000–2001. In 2001, Dana taught at Skaneateles Central Schools, where he led courses in Math A, Math AB, Special Education Math, Geometry, and Calculus for 7 years. Dana coached football, basketball, and softball. In 2000, Dana became a T<sup>3</sup> (Teachers Teaching with Technology) Instructor, delivering hands-on graphing calculator workshops to educators across New York State.

In 2008, Dana became an Educational Technology Consultant with Texas Instruments. For 18 years, Dana has supported over 50,000 educators through free professional development opportunities, across the U.S. and internationally. He presents at conferences including AMTNYS, LIMACON, NCTM, NYSCATE, PCTM, regularly partners with BOCES, works with preservice teachers and Master Teacher cohorts.

Dana served as the Cayuga County Teacher Center Executive Board Representative, Entertainment Chair for Summer AMTNYS at Wells College, and Banquet Chair for AMTNYS in Saratoga Springs. His professional accolades include the 2013 Texas Instruments Recognition of Excellence, the 2019 Friends of AMTNYS Award, and the 2020 STANYS Dedicated Service Award. Most recently, Dana was inducted into the New York State Mathematics Educators' Hall of Fame.

Dana was born and raised in Moravia, NY, and has lived in Central NY, NY City, and Long Island, and now proudly calls Rochester, NY his home. He lives there with his wife, Susan, and their two children, Salvatore and Aurora.
